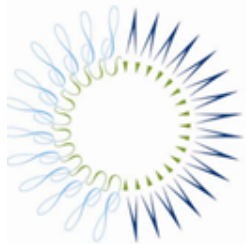

Key Findings

- Voters In Each Of These Swing Districts See Global Warming As A Real And Serious Threat That Is Happening Now
- Voters In Each Swing District Believe Efforts To Reduce Global Warming Will Create Jobs, Not Eliminate Them
- Voters In Each District Strongly Favor Action To Reduce Carbon Emissions
- A Candidate Using A Supporter's Message Overwhelms An Opponent Using The Opposition's Arguments



Methodology

P O L L

- Surveys In 4 Swing Congressional Districts In FL-2, NM-2, OH-16, And VA-5
- 400 Likely 2010 General Election Voters In Each District
- Interviews Conducted:
 - FL-2: 7/30 - 8/02
 - NM-2: 8/6 - 8/9
 - OH-16: 8/17 – 8/19
 - VA-5: 8/20 – 8/23
- Margin Of Error +/- 4.9% Overall, Higher For Subgroups

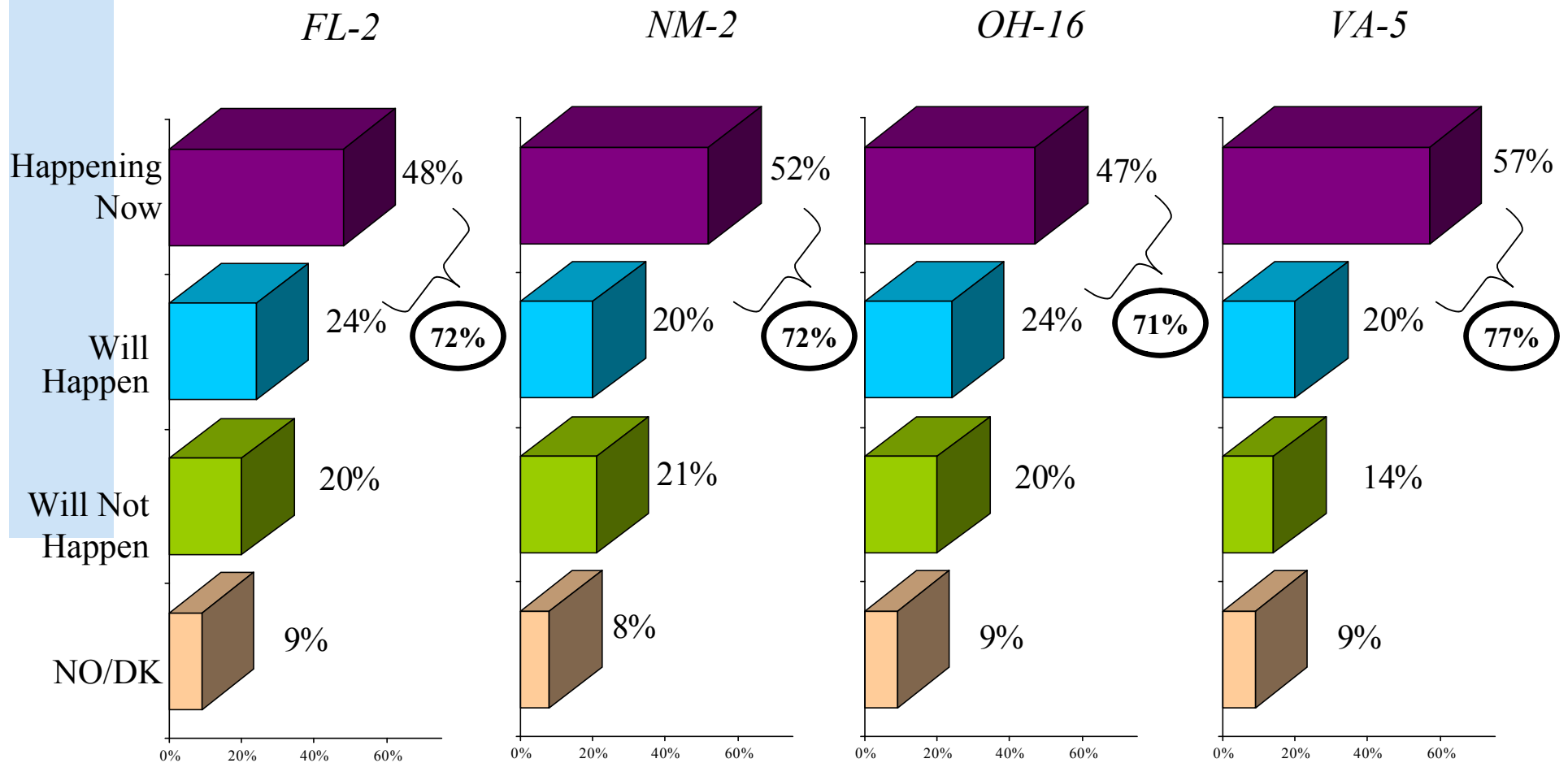




**Voters In Each Of These Swing

Is Happening Now**

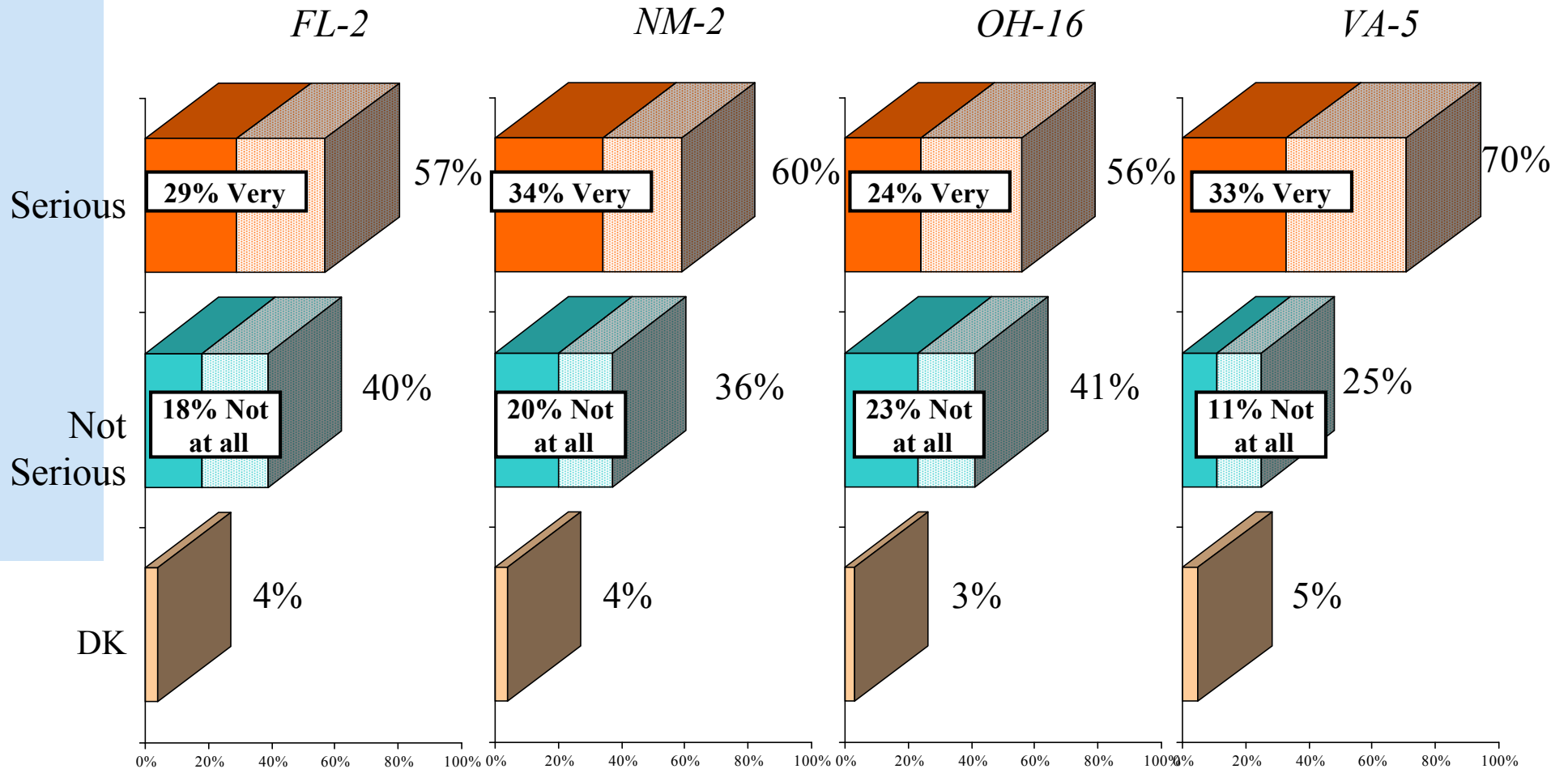
Large Majorities In Each District Believe Global Warming Is Either Happening Now Or Will Happen

Generally speaking, how serious of a threat do you think global warming is today – very serious, somewhat serious, not too serious, or not serious at all – or don't you have an opinion on this?



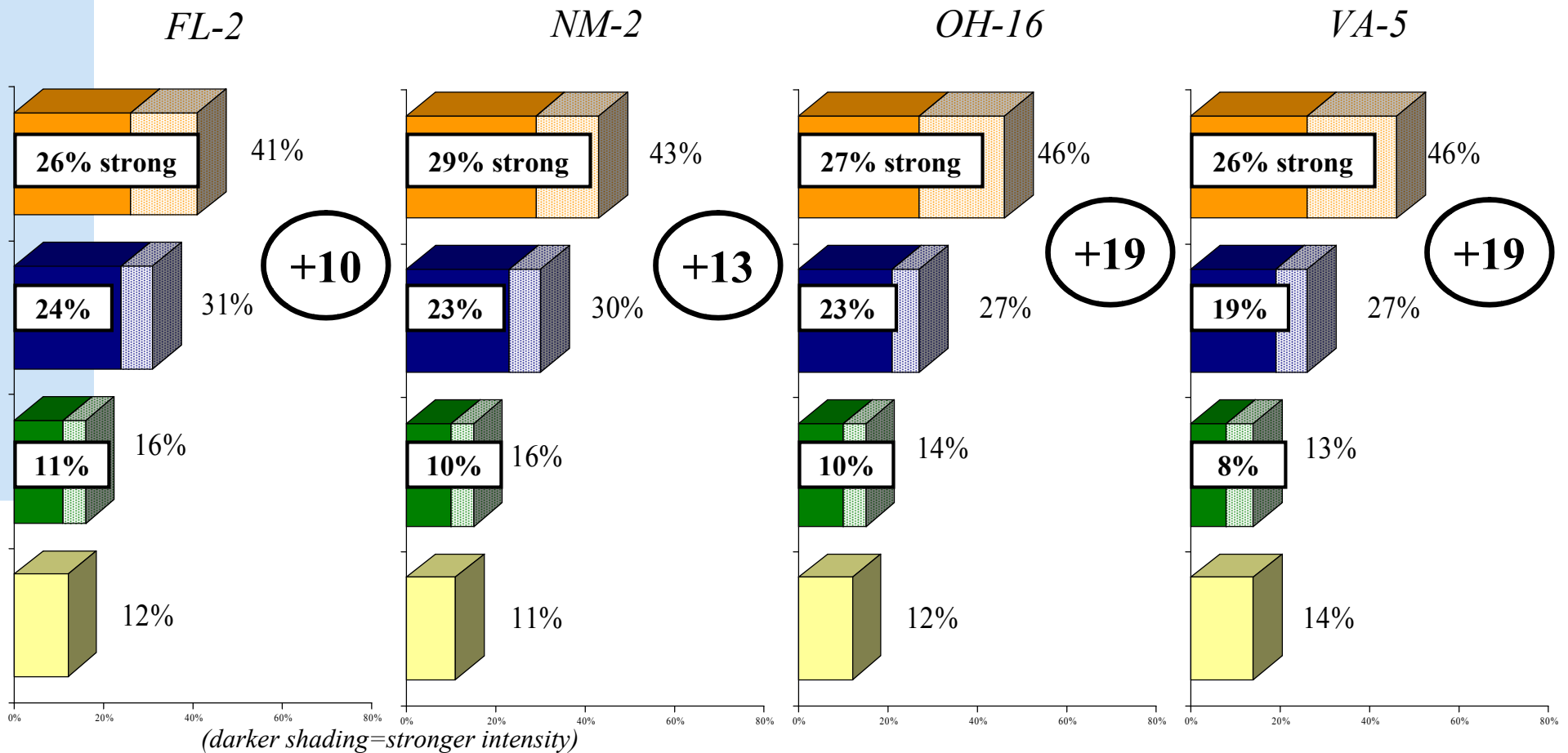

- Efforts to reduce global warming will not affect American jobs

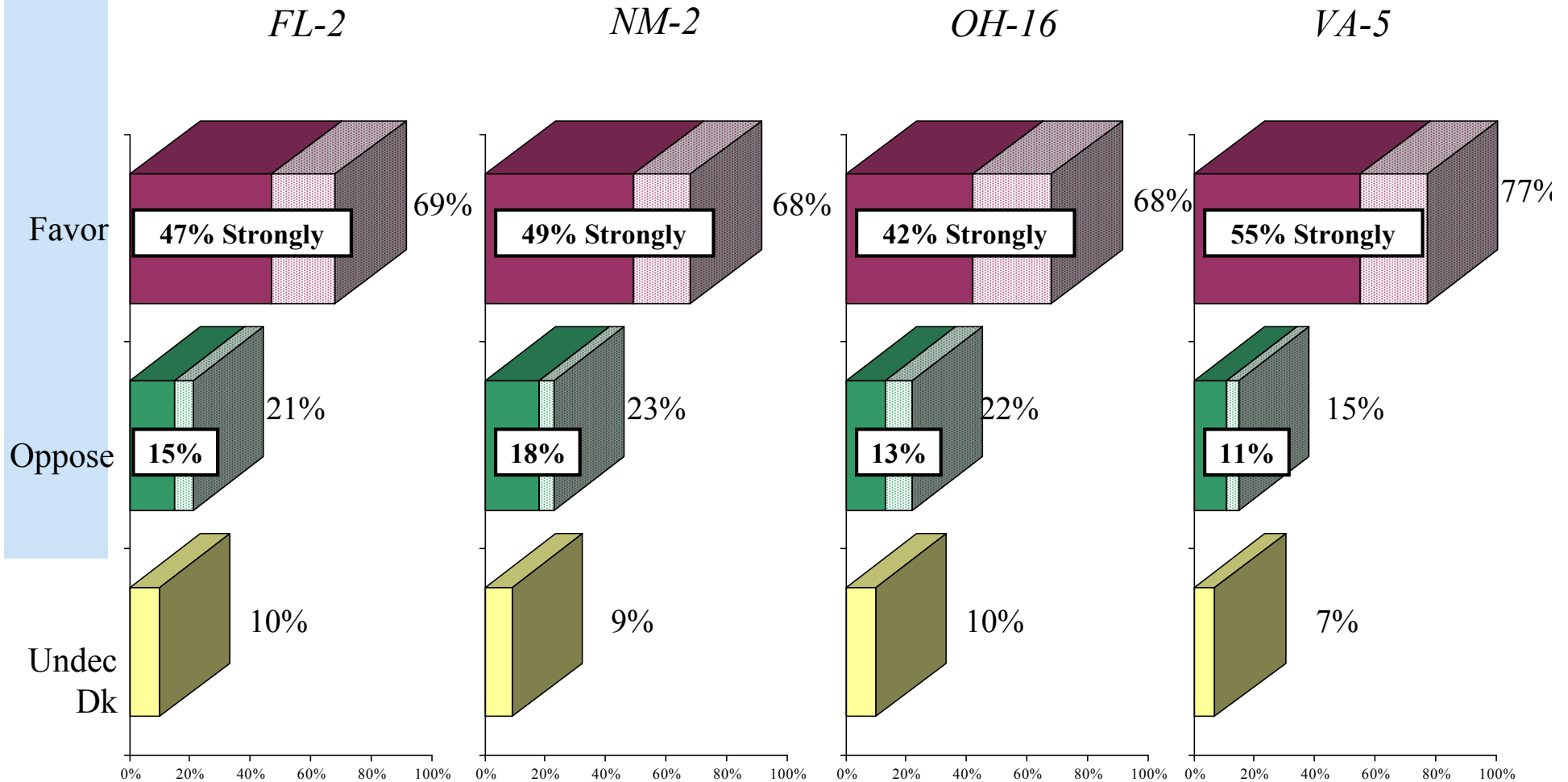

Do you favor or oppose the United States taking action to reduce its emissions of gases like carbon dioxide that cause global warming?

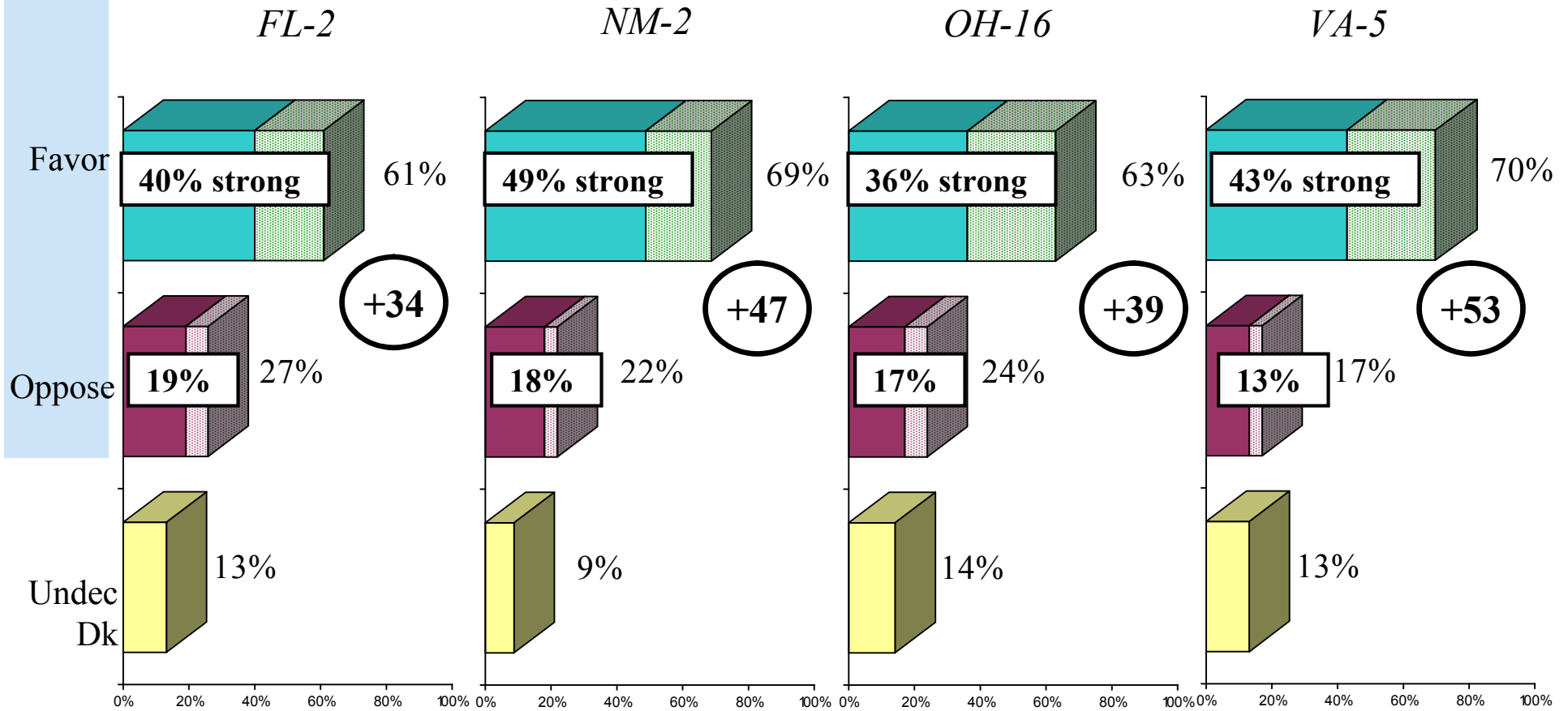

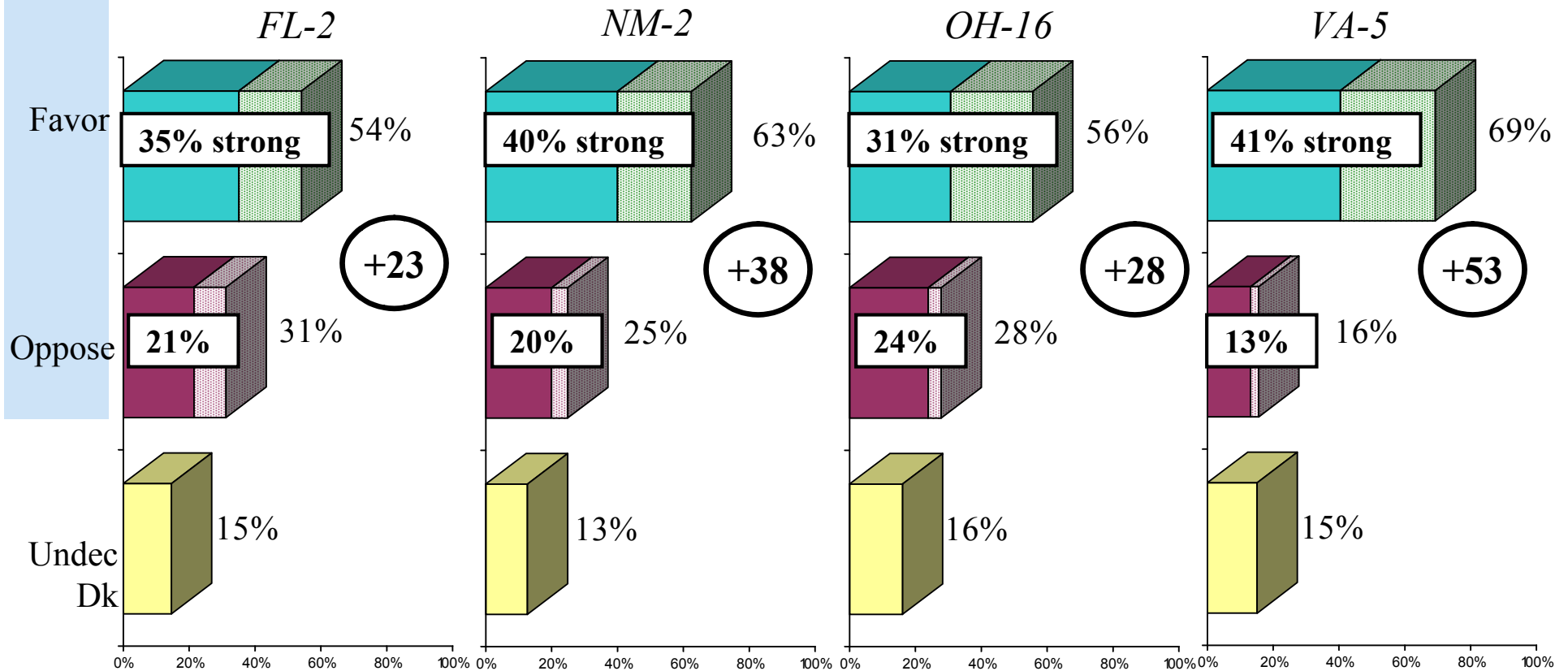

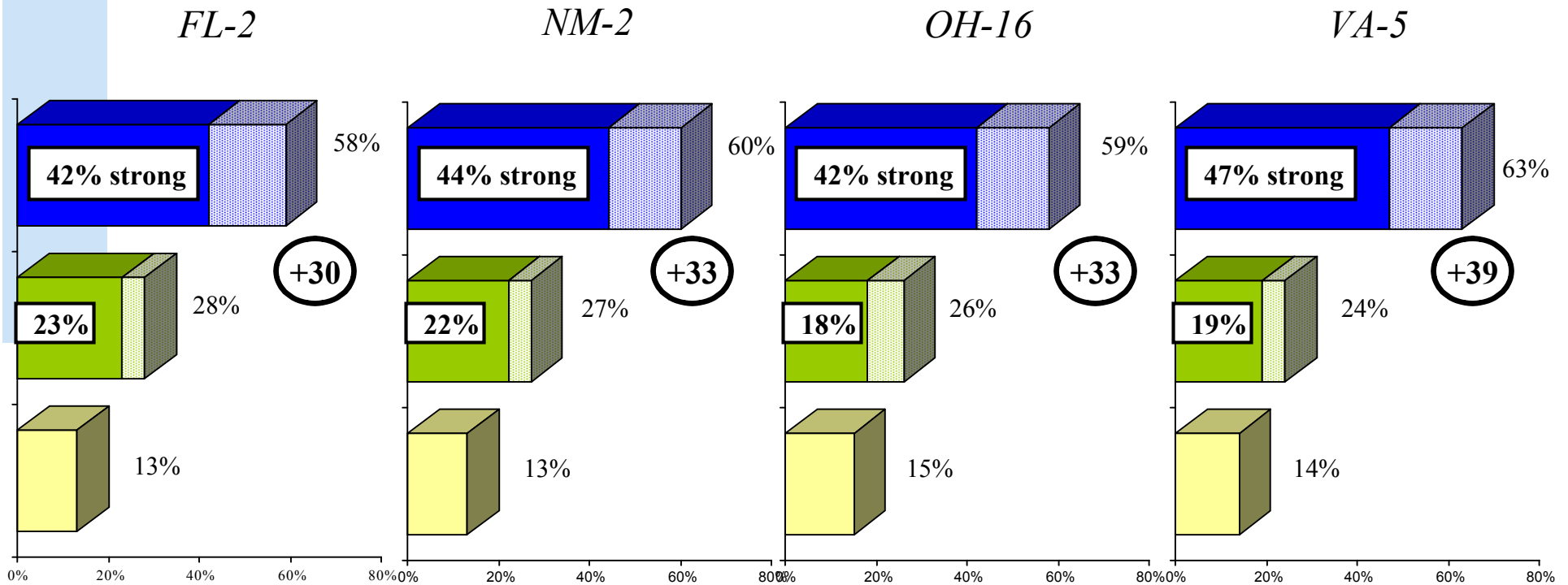

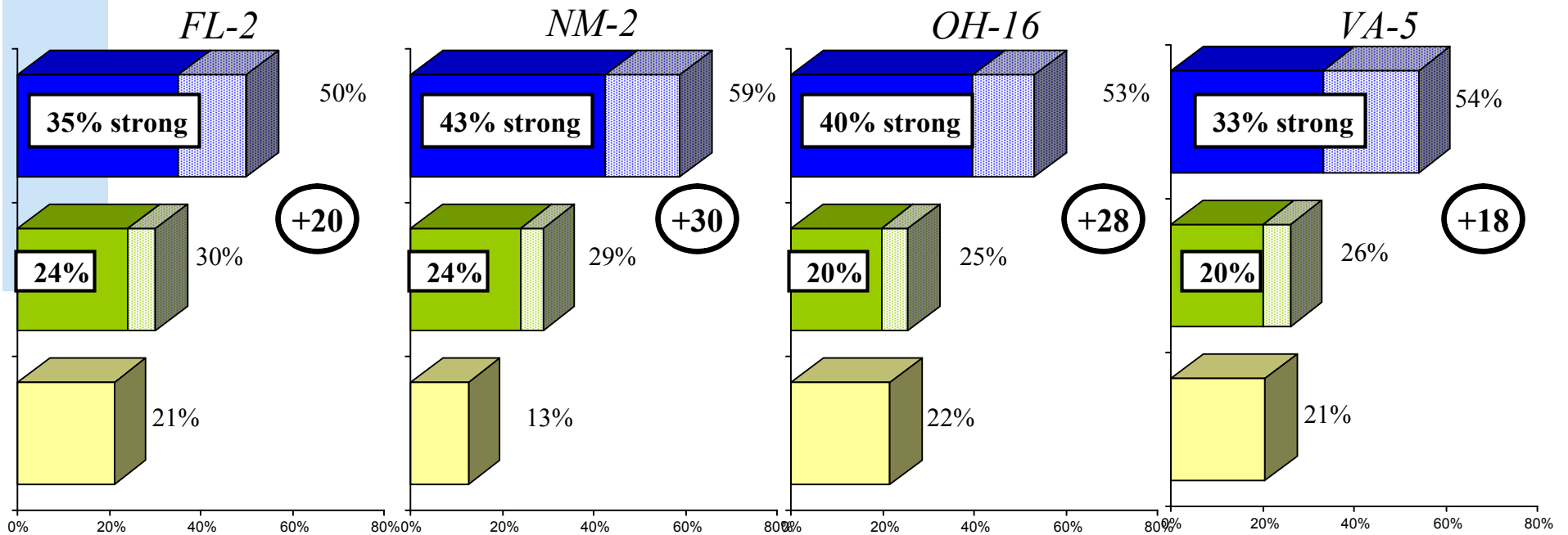


Majorities Of Independents In Each District Would Vote For A Bill Supporter Over An Opponent Of The Bill

For which of the following candidates for US Congress would you rather vote:

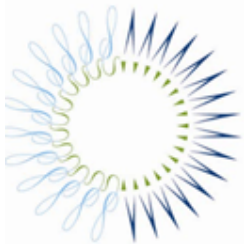
